

ANNUAL MEETING SCHEDULED

AVIATION HISTORY, SOME RELATING TO PAN AM

Anusewicz. Some years ago, he worked for Antilles Air Boats. By means of a power point presentation, he will share his personal story with the airline which was owned by Captain Charles Blair and his wife, Actress Maureen O'Hara. In his talk, "Seaplanes and Flying Boats", Anusewicz will touch on early Pan Am days and, as the years went by, how flying boats and seaplanes continued to operate until the surviving aircraft found a museum so their stories could still go on.

Anusewicz has had a long career in the aviation industry. He has worked for private business aviation companies and is currently president of Oke`e Aviation Services at Honolulu International Airport. He has worked for other private business aviation companies in the past. He will include some stories of his experiences meeting the rich and famous during those years. We know you will enjoy hearing his presentation.

We would like to add a comment or two about Captain Charlie Blair. Many Pan Am employees will remember Captain Blair, who was involved in many

aspects of aviation. The first time I met him was on a flight to Saigon during the Vietnam war. I was surprised to see him leave the cockpit immediately after landing, appearing to be in a great hurry. I was informed by the Station Manager that Blair had to go to Bangkok but would be back in time for our departure. A plane was standing by to take him to an important meeting there. I later



learned that Blair was a Brigadier General as well as a Pan Am pilot. Other people will remember Blair as a pilot who set many aviation records.

On the previous page is a photo of Charles Blair and Maureen O'Hara. Those of you who are going to the "Irish Spring" Pan Am event in Foynes may be interested to know that Maureen O'Hara made significant donations to the Flying Boat and Aviation Museum at Foynes.

We hope to see many members at this meeting. ANOTHER STORY FROM PERRY BROWN

In the last issue we covered the presentation given to us by Aviation Accident Investigator Perry Brown. Due to space limitations, we could not include all his stories but here is another one we thought you would enjoy. His first such story was about some ham radio operators who wanted to

establish a ham radio station on Kingman Reef, which is an uninhabited atoll about 35 miles NW of Palmyra. There were two Lodestar Twin Otters in Honolulu and they chartered one of them to take them to Palmyra. Piloting the aircraft was a pilot who was with a major commercial carrier (not PA), doing the trip on his own time. He had never flown that particular aircraft and, when they arrived, they crash landed. One woman was injured so they contacted the Coast Guard. When the Coast Guard arrived, they were all offered transportation back to Honolulu but only the pilot and wounded passenger accepted. The others decided to continue with their plans to take their gear to Kingman Reef by boat. They figured they could charter the other twin otter when they got back to Palmyra. It turned out that the other twin otter was grounded for mechanical reasons. What to do? A doctor in the group bandaged his own hand and they called the Coast Guard again to report that the doctor needed to be rescued. The Coast Guard picked them up, but later discovered the doctor was faking his injury. The group was required to pay for their rescue.

Jack told him he had no clue what he was talking about. Sam gave him a very fast on-the-job training session and Jack learned that the graveyard shift was actually the first shift of the day rather than the last one. He said that without Sam's help, the morning departures would have been a disaster. Jack's potential must have been obvious as he stayed with Pan Am for 36 years. . . . GONE BUT NOT FORGOTTEN . . .

Gilbert Iwanaga, a long time member of PAA, passed away on August 28th at the age of 84. He started with Pan Am in Passenger Services in 1959. He later became a Reservations/Ticket Office



Manager. In 1986 when Pan Am left the Pacific, he became a concierge at United Airlines. It was a program designed to take care of the company's major frequent travelers. A concierge would assist the VIPs when flights were delayed, rebook them when necessary and offer them special services. Iwanaga spoke Japanese and one customer assigned to him was the well-known Japanese entrepreneur, Genshiro Kawamoto. Iwanaga is survived by his wife, Jennine, a son who lives in Hawaii and a daughter who lives in Washington State. The photo on the left is from our archives.

In our previous issue we announced the passing of flight attendant **Lee Manfredi** on August 19th. Her daughter, Chelsea, who lives in Los Angeles, was here in the islands to help her mother after she was in at-home hospice care. She has now organized a memorial service that will take place at Thurston Memorial Chapel at Punahou School on **October 17th**. Visitation will be at 1:30 PM and the service will be at 2:30 PM. A reception will follow the service. Suggested donations are the University of Hawaii Foundation, the Hawaii Symphony Orchestra, or Special Olympics, Hawaii.

Levi Chang worked in Cargo, Passenger Services, Load Control and Reservations during his Pan Am years—and possibly even other departments. He passed away on August 28th. He was a graduate of St. Louis, class of '62, and is remembered by fellow employees as "smart, popular, kind and a humorous fellow; a good family man, educator and a fine employee". He was a sports enthusiast and refereed games, and often served as a timekeeper or a linesman at football games at Aloha Stadium. His son, Timmy Chang, was a quarterback for UH under June Jones. After Pan Am, Levi Chang became an educator and served as principal of Nanakuli High School. A service for Chang will be held on **October 7th** at Direction of the Lord Catholic Church in Waipio Gentry. Visitation will start at 8:30 with Mass to follow at 11:30. Lunch will be served after Mass.

HALE KOA HOTEL INFORMATION ON ENTRANCE, PARKING, BEVERAGE PAYMENTS, ETC.

- Location is the Waikiki Ballroom across from the Warrior Bar
- Doors open at 5:30 PM. Cash bar will be available and buffet will begin at approximately 6:30.
 The menu is the same "International Buffet" which has been well received by our members in
 the past. If you have difficulty moving through a buffet line, please do not be concerned. Other
 members will assist you.
- Cash is required for all alcoholic beverages and soft drinks. Credit cards are not accepted.
- Photo ID is required, though not always checked, since the Hale Koa is a military facility. Your driver's license or other government-issued photo ID will suffice.
- Parking is available in the Fort Derussy parking garage across the street from the hotel and is \$5.00 with validation which will be available when you sign in at the ballroom door. Drivers with guests can drive to the front entrance, drop their guests at the front lobby, and drive from there to the garage. It is convenient for guests who cannot walk very far or who have trouble with stairs.
- For the handicapped: Drivers with handicapped guests can drive through the security entrance to the back lobby, to drop them off, and then proceed to the parking garage. The back lobby is closer to the ballroom where the gala will be held. The security person on duty will need to have the name of the driver and his or her guest(s) in advance.
