A New Generation of Voters!



Now that the Primary Elections are over Kids Voting Hawaii moves into full swing. Kids Voting Hawaii is a non-profit, non-partisan, volunteer organization dedicated to educating students about the democratic process and getting our youth into the habit of voting.

The purpose is to prepare all school-aged youth with the information and experience to participate as citizens and to sustain American democracy through deliberate instruction in voter education. The mission of Kids Voting Hawaii is to educate youth to become responsible voters and to promote adult voter participation. Kids Voting Hawaii provides an age-appropriate curriculum and classroom activities, which align with the Hawaii State Social Studies Standards, and address the civic responsibility and civic character measurement.

An affiliate of Kids Voting USA, Kids Voting Hawaii was initiated in 1996. In the first three General Elections, more than 125,000 students voted at adult polling sites on paper ballots for only the major candidates. In 2002 General Election, Hawaii students were the first in the nation to vote statewide by computer. Over 88,000 Hawaii students voted. In General Election 2006, Hawaii students again will vote via the internet.



How Students Register and Vote with Kids Voting Hawaii 2006



Every vote that is submitted in the Kids Voting Hawaii General Election is private. When a student submits a completed ballot, the teacher will receive electronic notification that the student has voted, but not how the student voted.

Students are encouraged to discuss the General Election candidates and issues with their parents, friends and relatives. Staring today Monday, September 25th, students can call up online the same Genral Election ballot their parents will see November 7th. Kids are encouraged to take their folks on a virtual tour of Kids Voting Hawaii website, so they can see the ballot ahead of time. Parents are encouraged to provide access to home or office computers to their kids, so they can log on and practice, or vote for real.

On Election Day - November 7th, Metro will assist, at our assigned precinct, those that were not able to cast their ballot at home or school to ensure that all students of Hawaii have had their opportunity to vote!




