Tailored for PAA


Tom Anusewicz, left, tailored his talk about the Antilles Air Boats for our Pan Am group. He worked for the airline which was started by the late Pan Am Captain Charlie Blair and his wife, Maureen O'Hara. He included slides and videos of the early flying clippers operated by Pan American World Airways in the 1930s. Read on below for his stories.

THE FABULOUS FLYING BOATS

Tom Anusewicz has worked in aviation related fields for 48 years; from flight engineer in the U.S. Coast Guard in the 1960s to flight engineer on 707/727 aircraft at SPIA, Managing Director of Circle Rainbow Air, to devel-

opment of private jet terminals in Hawaii. He was a founding partner and Executive Vice President of Bradley Pacific Aviation. He is now in retirement as an aviation consultant.

In 1963 Charlie Blair and his wife, Maureen O'Hara, started Antilles Air Boats in the Caribbean while he was still a Pan Am Captain. Anusewicz was offered a job as a mechanic because of his background in the Coast



Anusewicz prepared a slide show with video clips of the flying boats which he tailored for our Pan Am group. His power point presentation started with clips of the early Sikorsky flying boats Pan American operated in 1934, followed a year later by the Martin M-130, an aircraft designed to cross the Pacific. They were known as the flying clipper ships. He covered other flying boats Pan Am operated, such as the B-314s, dubbed the China Clippers. It is still fascinating to see videos of these aircraft spewing up huge trails of white spray as they worked to break the grip of the water on take-off.

Anusewicz then focused on the flying boats owned by Antilles Air Boats. Blair had purchased a couple of Sandringham Flying Boats from Australia's Ansett Airlines. The Sandringham was the civilian version of the Sunderland flying boat designed by the British for its air force. Antilles Air Boats became the largest flying boat operation in the world, using flying boats designed by Grumman. Blair died in 1978 in a Grumman Goose he was piloting. Maureen continued to run the airline for another year, becoming the first female owner of an airline.

Anusewicz added personal notes about Maureen and Charles. Charles did not particularly like many of the Hollywood types with whom Maureen was acquainted but John Wayne was one of her closest friends. It was fortunate that Charles Blair and John Wayne were like-minded individuals. Anusewicz says they were like brothers from the day they met. Anusewicz recently called Maureen to tell her he was going to speak at a luncheon for a Pan Am group. It was the last time he contacted her as she passed away just over a week ago—on Saturday, October 24th.



We are saddened to report the passing of **Paula Helfrich** on October 6th. She was 69. Paula was well known in Pan Am's World. She arrived at her Pan Am stewardess training class with much more awareness of multiculturalism than did most of us. She was born in Illinois and raised in Burma, now known as Myanmar, where her father ran a teak mill. She went to high school at a convent in Darjeeling, India. She had many interests, one might say passions, which led to her connections with people from all walks of life. She started her Pan Am career as a stewardess. While based in Honolulu, she attended UH where she continued her studies in anthropology and


archeology. After her second daughter was born, she quit flying and took a ground position, starting in Ramps Ops/Operations. Af-


ter Pan Am left the islands, Paula became Executive Director of the Military Affairs Council of the Chamber of Commerce, enabling her to lobby for federal funds for the state. She worked closely with the State of Hawaii Department of Economic Development. She returned to Myanmar about 9 years ago and 5 years later married Saw Philip BayNaySee. She coauthored a book titled *Flying—a novel*. She is survived by her husband, Saw Philip; 2 daughters, Laurien and Andrea Helfrich-Nuss; sisters Eleanor Helfrich, Mary M. Uyeda, Elizabeth Barton, and Catherine Williams; and brother Thomas. Paula will be sorely missed, not only because of her personality but because her love of history resulted in her extensive knowledge about many aspects of Pan American's operations in Hawaii.




2016 Collector Calendars Available

HALE KOA HOTEL INFORMATION ON ENTRANCE, PARKING, BEVERAGE PAYMENTS, ETC.

- Location is the Waikiki Ballroom across from the Warrior Bar
- Doors open at 5:30 PM. Cash bar will be available and buffet will begin at approximately 6:30.
 The menu is the same "International Buffet" which has been well received by our members in
 the past. If you have difficulty moving through a buffet line, please do not be concerned. Other
 members will assist you.
- Cash is required for all alcoholic beverages and soft drinks. Credit cards are not accepted.
- Photo ID is required, though not always checked, since the Hale Koa is a military facility. Your
 driver's license or other government-issued photo ID will suffice.
- Parking is available in the Fort Derussy parking garage across the street from the hotel and is \$5.00 with validation which will be available when you sign in at the ballroom door. Drivers with guests can drive to the front entrance, drop their guests at the front lobby, and drive from there to the garage. It is convenient for guests who cannot walk very far or who have trouble with stairs.
- For the handicapped: Drivers with handicapped guests can drive through the security entrance to the back lobby, to drop them off, and then proceed to the parking garage. The back lobby is closer to the ballroom where the gala will be held. The security person on duty will need to have the name of the driver and his or her guest(s) in advance.
